A SUCCESSFUL OUTDOOR EDUCATION EXPERIENCE

We are pleased to report on the highly successful Year 8 residential trip to Arete Outdoor Centre in Eryri, which took place from 30th April -2nd May 2025. Under exceptional weather conditions, our students participated in a diverse range of challenging outdoor activities while demonstrating remarkable personal growth and social development.

Taking full advantage of the splendid weather, students engaged primarily in water-based activities across various natural environments:

- Coasteering along the magnificent cliffs of Anglesey
- Canyoning through rugged terrain and natural water features
- Rafting on Llyn Padarn, testing teamwork and communication skills
- Rock climbing on local formations, building confidence and resilience
- Hill walking expeditions, exploring the magnificent Welsh landscape

The program was complemented by targeted team-building exercises designed to foster collaboration and mutual support among students.

One of the most encouraging aspects of the trip was the notable social engagement between students. Staff observed that not once did pupils request access to their mobile devices—a powerful indication that they were forming meaningful connections with their peers. Evenings featured spontaneous entertainment, including student-led karaoke sessions that showcased their creativity and enthusiasm.

The residential experience provided valuable opportunities for students to develop essential life skills like preparing their own packed lunches and sandwiches, serving refreshments to one another and contributing to communal clean-up responsibilities. It is our sincere hope that these domestic skills have continued since their return home.

After days filled with physical activity and adventure, students settled easily at night, demonstrating healthy exhaustion from their endeavours. Each morning, they awoke refreshed and eager to participate in the day's planned activities—a testament to both their enthusiasm and the engaging nature of the program.

Trip supervisors Miss Davies, Mr Jones, and Mrs Loxam have expressed their pride in our Year 8 students, noting that the pupils were "a credit to the school and a pleasure to take." Their exemplary behaviour and positive attitude throughout the trip reflect the values we aim to instil in all our students.










DIWEDDARIAD SYSTEM TŶ HOUSE SYSTEM UPDATE
