NEGES O'R PRIFATHRO MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Recently the school has adopted some new and also some revamped strategies in lessons to increase the challenge for our learners. The way that we ask questions has changed and it has been really interesting to see how the students have responded, especially to what is termed 'cold-calling' and 'no opt out'. These strategies have kept the students alert during lessons and we intend on building on them throughout the year. If you were to ask when your child comes home, whether there has been an injection of extra challenge by teachers adopting a different approach to questioning this term, I would



be confident that they would be able to describe a change of focus.

This is one of the key strategies that we have adopted recently, and we hope to be able to share some of the other ways in which we are addressing the Estyn Recommendations early into the Spring term, following key feedback from Estyn around our plans and actions that will take place over the coming weeks.

We have been pleased with how our learners have adapted to changes, and recently we have been especially pleased with how our Year 11 students have managed themselves during their mock examinations. By attending additional support sessions, remaining focused in class and by maintaining a high attendance throughout the term they have managed to take these in their stride

As the colder months have crept up on us we have maintained the insistence on the need for good attendance to school, and we want to take the opportunity to thank all of our families for their support with this. In addition to this we are also very grateful for parents/carers support with uniform. We will be emphasising the importance of high attendance and reminding students about uniform standards before the end of term, to ensure that these remain a key focus. Sometimes we have occasions when it gets colder where students try to replace a coat with a hoody. Please can we ask that you insist that it is not appropriate to do this. Hoody's are not part of the school uniform and students will be asked to remove them.

In the coming weeks we have some exciting events, that include trips and visits and also our Christmas Concert. We also have some parents evenings for our Sixth form students. We look forward to these and to all of the usual exciting activities that the end of term brings.

They spent the day working with Year 9 students, running activities linked to careers in medical health services. Pupils received careers guidance about the opportunities open to them, as well as hands on activities about keyhole surgery, radiography and CPR. Pupils seemed to especially enjoy the challenge of using remote surgical equipment to build a stack of sugar cubes!

The visit was very informative and engaging and has definitely encouraged some of the Year 9 pupils to start to consider their career pathways. Well done to the pupils for participating so positively and a big thank you to our visitors!





CLWB GWYDDONIAETH SCIENCE CLUB

Our Halloween-themed Science Club was a success, with an amazing 36 pupils attending!

Students became spooky scientists for the afternoon, creating bubbling potions, designing colourful lava lamps, and making chromatography ghosts. The laboratory was filled with excitement as pupils got hands-on with practical chemistry while learning about different chemical reactions and techniques.

It was wonderful to see so many enthusiastic young scientists engaged in such fun experiments. Thank you to all our Science Club members for making this our most popular session yet!



On Bonfire Night, 32 pupils attended our science club, exploring the chemistry behind fireworks! Students conducted flame tests with metal salts, producing the vibrant colours seen in fireworks displays. They created mini sparklers by heating iron filings on splints, observing the golden sparks as the metal oxidized. Finally, they performed a Skittles diffusion experiment, to create colourful patterns. The session finished with demonstrations of the 'methane bubbles' practical which finished off the night with great excitement!




Special mentions go to Jude, Jodie, Ryan, Beth, and Maddie for placing in the top three in multiple races.
