CROESO ~ WELCOME

Dear Parent/Carer

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome you and your child to our community here at Welshpool High School; we look forward to working with you during the next 5 years and beyond.

In this booklet hopefully all of your questions regarding transition, and the transition days will be answered - and if they're not, there are contact details provided so you can ask us directly.

Your child will have hopefully had a visit from Ms Haycock, who has talked them through what to expect on the transition days, and has already answered any questions they may have had.



WHS staff have also spoken to your child's class teacher, to discuss what, if any, support is needed during this transitional period and beyond, both academically and pastorally.



DIWRNODAU PONTIO ~ TRANSITION DAYS

This year transition days are Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th July. On these days Year 6 pupils will have a taste of high school life. The days will run from **8.55am until 3.30pm**.

Your child has been advised to make themselves aware of where and when the WHS buses pick up near them. Bus companies have been notified to pick up any Year 6 children. For those being dropped off, our preferred drop off point is the Flash car park. Students do **NOT** attend primary school first.

This will be a busy time so can we please ask parents not to congregate. Students have been made aware that WHS staff will meet them in front of Theatr Clera, directly front and centre of our building.

On arrival, they will be grouped into forms, and will follow a sample timetable. They should wear their own clothes, something suitable for the weather. They will be led around school, by our current students, and all come back together again for lunch, which will be in two sittings to allow for more efficiency in the canteen. For the day they need to bring a pencil case with basic equipment in, and a refillable water bottle, both in a suitable bag for school.

The students will have a taster session of some subjects from across the curriculum, but mainly from the Health and Wellbeing and Expressive Arts areas of learning, i.e., a choice from PE, music, art, ICT, technology or drama. Some activities are devised in order to provide some experience of moving around school, but all are helping to build their confidence and enthusiasm about joining us in September.

CINIO ~ LUNCH

Your child should have been asked by their primary teacher if they wish to book a meal from our canteen. For students attending from a Welsh primary, this will be free using your primary school ParentPay account. Otherwise they should bring a packed lunch.

CINIO ~ LUNCH

Details of how to set up a Welshpool High School ParentPay account will be sent to you via email (if you have any problems setting this up, please contact **Mrs Liz Hughes**, whose contact details are included at the end of this letter).



On the morning of the first day in September we set this up, so your child may have a meal from the canteen if they wish, provided appropriate funds are added to the account.

Otherwise please send them with a packed lunch. Free school meals (eFSM) eligible children will access this at high school in exactly the same way as they do now, with credit for a main meal automatically being added to their account each day. The full menu and price list from Powys will be added to our website once we receive the version for September.

Please be assured we will not knowingly allow any child to go without, so if there are any issues we will aim to sort them at the time for the student, and contact you to resolve any issues.

Our newest students have a dedicated area reserved for them to enjoy break time in, so they don't need to negotiate a busy canteen. They will also have lunch earlier than the rest of the school initially, and staff will always be on hand to help them during these times.

DECHRAU YM MIS MEDI ~ STARTING IN SEPTEMBER

When the new term begins, on **Wednesday 2nd September 2026**, the new Year 7's will start the day as they did during transition, by meeting in front of the Theatre in order to remind them of their form groupings and to be collected by their form tutors.

We then have an administration morning, so all students remain within their forms with their tutors until break. During this time is when timetables, planners, maps of the school and general instructions for the day are issued. Then, after break, students begin following their timetable and attend lessons.

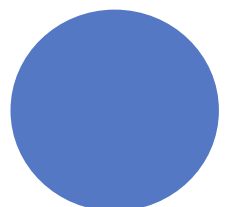

Protractor

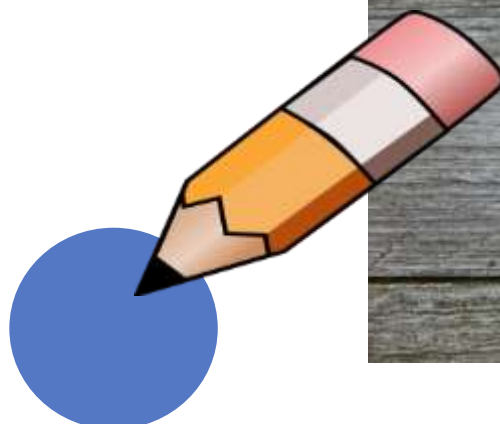
HB Pencils (for art)

Black FORMAL KNEE LENGTH school skirt, or TAILORED TROUSERS, not canvas, denim, corduroy or fashion trousers (please refer to photographs included for your guidance).

- Grey v-neck jumper (long sleeved or tank top) embroidered with school motif
- Plain white short or long sleeved shirt.
- Black blazer, embroidered with school motif.
- School tie
- Black or charcoal grey socks, or black tights.
- Black shoes (trainers included provided they are **all** black)
- A dark coloured coat or jacket (not hoodies)
- An apron for Food Technology and Art is required.



Our school uniform, including PE kit, are available to buy from Constructiv clothing-details are included. Please be aware of our uniform requirements and buy accordingly.

Constructiv are strongly advising parents to order their uniform in JULY, so there is a cut-off date in place of **24th July** to ensure delivery before the start of the new term.

The school are aware of the cost to parents having to purchase separate school shoes and trainers. Therefore, the choice is available for parents/carers as to which they prefer to purchase. However, school footwear must be **entirely black**. There must be no visible logos (in any colour different to black), on any part of the footwear that is worn.

Please note that sandals, flip flops, redback style boots and variations of these are not permitted as part of the uniform.

Uniforms should not be embellished with any additional fashion items (scarves, belts etc).

We have a range of donated uniform items at school, so please get in touch if we can help with uniform costs.

All Students:

- Black and green polo t-shirt
- Black shorts (these must be plain and of an appropriate length)
- Black football socks for football and hockey
- White sports socks (girls only)
- Trainers

Optional Items:

- Reversible Black/Green rugby top (Optional for Autumn/Winter term)
- Hooded top embroidered with school motif
- Black long sleeve base layer

Pupils **MUST** wear gum shields and shin pads for football, rugby and hockey.

FOR SAFETY REASONS NO JEWELLERY ALLOWED AND HAIR MUST BE TIED BACK.

Pupils will be expected to wear their PE kit for EVERY lesson. If they cannot take part for a medical reason, they need to bring a note, but will still need to bring their PE kit as they will be involved in the lesson in some capacity.

CLUSTDLYSAU (STYDIAU/BARIAU), GWALLT A THYLLAU WYNEB STUDS/BARS HAIR AND FACIAL PIERCINGS

Governors appreciate the inherent danger in studs/bars being worn and so advise that only one stud in each ear will be allowed, but these must be removed for PE lessons because of the increased danger.

No excessive makeup or extremes of hairstyle including tram lines, designs shaved into hair, or unnatural hair colours will be permitted, nor will facial piercings, i.e. lip, nose or eyebrow studs.

FFÔNAU SYMUDOL MOBILE PHONES

Students are allowed to bring mobile phones for contacting parents before or after the end of the school day, but they must remain switched off and in a school bag during the school day.

The school will not take any responsibility for loss or damage to any mobile phones brought into school. Mobiles will be confiscated if found being used during school hours, they will be taken to reception where they can be collected at the end of the school day. Three confiscations means a parent or carer will have to collect the phone from the school office.

The school takes no responsibility for items lost or damaged in school.

CLUDIANT YSGOL SCHOOL TRANSPORT



School transport may be utilised on the transition days, drivers have been made aware they should allow Y6 to board, but please be aware transport is NOT overseen by WHS, and we have provided timetables as a guide only.

Please be aware of where buses stop close to your residence and ensure your child is there in plenty of time. It will be your responsibility to transport your child to school if they miss a bus.
